

## Medical Information Technologies Procedure and Diagnosis Code Policy

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There is an optional EndoWorks software module (Advanced Reporting) that provides the user the ability to write the physician's procedure report. The report is written through the selection of user-definable keywords within a knowledge base that can generate sentences or lists within a user-definable formatted document. EndoWorks is shipped with default document templates, procedure report templates, and knowledge base that the customer is responsible for maintaining and keeping current. Certain medical coding-related information, which may not be current, may be accessed via the procedure report writing capabilities within EndoWorks.
